ORDER

On Thursday, February 10, 2022, at 12:01 a.m. (CST), the Bankruptcy Court for the Middle District of Tennessee will take CM/ECF offline to upgrade to NextGen CM/ECF. The system will be unavailable for filing from 12:01 a.m. (CST) on Thursday, February 10, 2022, until Monday, February 14, 2022, at 8:00 a.m. (CST). During that time, Notices of Electronic Filing will not be issued. Any court-imposed deadlines falling on Thursday, February 10, 2022, or Friday, February 11, 2022, are extended to midnight on Monday, February 14, 2022. (Deadlines imposed by statute or rule rather than being court-imposed should be addressed by e-mail or in-person filing measures outlined below).

During the period when CM/ECF is unavailable, and in addition to in-person filing, the Clerk's Office will accept via e-mail time-sensitive filings, such as filings nearing statute of limitations deadlines, requests for emergency injunctive relief, and notices of appeal. Counsel or self-represented parties who are concerned about whether a filing must be submitted to the Clerk to ensure its timeliness should either (1) file in-person at the intake counter located at 701 Broadway, First Floor, Room 170, Nashville, Tennessee, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. or (2) submit the filing by e-mail during the period when CM/ECF is unavailable. Documents submitted by email must be sent to EmergencyFiling@tnmb.uscourts.gov and will be deemed filed as of the date received on the email.

Any documents submitted via e-mail during this time will be entered on the docket by the Clerk's Office as soon as practical after CM/ECF is operational.
