ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 22-5

The Court hereby approves procedures for scheduling court matters and appearing in cases and proceedings in this district as set forth on the Court's website located at www.tnmb.uscourts.gov.

1. Administrative orders 20-4, 2021-1 and 2021-3 are hereby rescinded effective November 1, 2022.

2. Beginning November 1, 2022, anyone wishing to schedule or participate in a Court matter, case, or proceeding is responsible for viewing the Court procedures section (including detailed instructions for the Chapter 13 Consolidated Motion Docket and the Cookeville/Columbia Motion Dockets) found on the Court's website.

5. Notwithstanding the provisions in this Order, the Court will consider, on a case-by-case basis, motions to modify procedures for a particular hearing, conference, or trial.
